OVERVIEW

The Chattahoochee Nature Center in partnership with the Roswell Arts Fund invite you to submit artist qualifications to be considered for an outdoor sculptural project that will be installed at the Chattahoochee Nature Center's Wildlife Walk, featuring Georgia Raptors. The purpose of this project is to provide a sitting area that invites visitors to rest and linger as they explore the center's I27 acres of trails through forest, wetland, and river habitats.

SCOPE

An outdoor installation of functional artwork is desired for the Chattahoochee Nature Center's grounds to create a sense of place where visitors can rest comfortably. This may be some type of seating, whether it's benches, stools, hammock and so on. Material choice should be carefully considered for safety for all ages and abilities, durability under the outdoor elements year-round, aesthetics, and theme. Recycled and nature friendly materials are welcome.

SITE

The project's specific site sits by the water, under the shade of two giant Magnolia trees, and next to the Aviary, which features two adult Bald Eagles. This area measures approximately 27 feet by 17 feet. Ground conditions: unleveled, compiled of dirt, roots from the Magnolia trees, rocks and red Georgia clay.

THEME

The theme of this project should speak to the birds and eagles themselves, the natural habitat and/or general wildlife, or the Cherokee and Muscogee peoples, the original stewards of the lands surrounding the Chattahoochee River.

BUDGET

\$37,500 all inclusive, design, manufacturing and installation. Award distributed in three installments.
